

### **ES Policy on Promoting External Activities**

*ES would like to support many Christian activities. However, because it would be impractical and imprudent to endorse every proposed activity, the Executive Committee has agreed to the following framework and principles in determining a case-by-case basis which activities we will promote.*

1. It is the responsibility of the Executive Committee to decide which activities should be promoted at ES, and any requests for promotion should be directed to the Executive Committee.
2. The primary consideration is whether or not an activity is aligned with the ES Doctrinal Basis. Also of crucial importance is whether the event's aim is to grow students in accordance with the three core objectives of ES. If this is not the case, the Executive Committee may perceive that the event will be of direct benefit to students, in accordance with the three core objectives, despite this not being the aim of the event.
3. The Executive Committee may perceive that an event will detract from ES or AFES activities, in which case the event will not be promoted. An example of an event that may detract from ES or AFES events might include a direct clash in the time the events take place, or events requiring such a large amount of time or finance that they may prevent ES members from being involved in ES or AFES activities.
4. Only ES or AFES run activities will be promoted by being printed in or on the back of 'The Bible Talks' booklets. The means and method by which an external activity is promoted will be considered by the Executive Committee, with options including:
  - Announcements at 'The Bible Talks'
  - Brochures being made available at 'The Bible Talks'
  - Brochures being handed out at 'The Bible Talks', inside booklets.
  - Group emails
  - Promotion via the ES Website
  - Flyers left in the ES room
5. The degree to which an activity affects and is open to the whole of ES is an important consideration; however personal news concerning ES members can be announced if appropriate.
